1. **Sunday** – Worship/Time With Family/Review Answers With Others

2. **Monday** –

1) **Isaiah 42 – Read & Answer Below**

- a) Read Isaiah 42:1-3. Read Matthew 12:15-21. Is this section of Isaiah prophetic/Messianic? (Yes!)
- b) Speaking of His special servant, in what verse does God (through Isaiah) say of this servant that “...He shall bring forth judgment to the Gentiles?” (Isaiah 42:1)
- c) Read the end of Isaiah 42:4. Does Christ (the prophesied Messiah herein noted) have “law?” (Yes! Cf., Galatians 6:2, Romans 8:2, James 1:25, etc.)
- d) How many times are “the Gentiles” mentioned within the highly Messianic early section of this chapter? (Twice, vs. 1, 6)
- e) Beginning a section dealing with singing praise to God, Isaiah 42:10 begins, “Sing unto the Lord a new _____, and His _____ from the end of the earth...” (song; praise)
- f) What verse begins, “And I will bring the blind by a way that they knew not...?” (Isaiah 42:16)
- g) What verse begins, “But this is a people robbed and spoiled...?” (Isaiah 42:22)
- h) What is the first question asked at the beginning of Isaiah 42:23? (Who among you will give ear to this?)
- i) According to the end of this chapter, did God overlook (allow to go unpunished) the sin of Judah? (No, vs. 24-25)

2) **Revelation 3 – Read Only**

3. **Tuesday** –

1) **Isaiah 43 – Read & Answer Below**

- a) In what early verse of this chapter does God say, “...O Israel, Fear not: for I have redeemed thee...?” (Isaiah 43:1)
- b) How many times is the phrase “fear not” found in this chapter? (Twice, vs. 1, 5)
- c) In what early verse does God say, “...for I have created him for My glory...?” (Isaiah 43:7)
- d) Isaiah 43:11 reads, “I, even I, am the Lord; and beside Me there is _____ Saviour.” (no)
- e) Isaiah 43:15 reads, “I am the Lord, your _____, the creator of Israel, your _____.” (Holy; One; King)
- f) Although God had done tremendous things for Israel, Isaiah 43:22 declares, “But thou hast not called upon me, O Jacob; but thou hast been _____ of Me, O Israel.” (weary)

- g) Read Isaiah 43:23-24. Instead of offering proper sacrifices to God, Israel _____ God with their iniquities/sins. (wearied)
- h) Is “Babylon” mentioned in this chapter? Is so, in what verse? (Yes, vs. 14)

2) Revelation 3 – Read & Answer Below

- a) This chapter begins with the Lord addressing the congregation in what city? (Sardis, vs. 1)
- b) In addition to the first congregation mentioned in this chapter, what two other congregations are addressed? (Philadelphia (vs. 7ff) and the Laodiceans (vs. 14ff))
- c) What congregation mentioned in this chapter (like Smyrna of chapter two) has only positive things said about it? (Philadelphia, vs. 7-13)
- d) In what verse does Jesus (as penned by the inspired apostle John) say, “He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the book of life...?” (Revelation 3:5)
- e) To what congregation did the Lord say, “...I have set before thee an open door...?” (Philadelphia, vs. 8)
- f) How many times is the word “overcometh” used in this chapter? (Three times, vs. 5, 12 and 21. Note – It is only used 10 times in the entire Bible, per the King James Version)
- g) What section of verses deal with Sardis? (Revelation 3:1-6)
- h) What section of verses deal with Philadelphia? (Revelation 3:7-13)
- i) What section of verses deal with the Laodiceans? (Revelation 3:14-22)

4. Wednesday –

1) Isaiah 44 – Read & Answer Below

- a) After reading this chapter, does a significant section of this chapter deal with the sin of idolatry? (Yes, cf., vs. 9-20, etc.)
- b) What early verse begins, “For I will pour water upon him that is thirsty...?” (Isaiah 44:3)
- c) Read Isaiah 44:6. Read Revelation 1:17. Is this verse Messianic and does it also prove (along with many other verses – Isaiah 9:6, 40:3, etc.) that Jesus is Deity? (Yes!)
- d) Notice the last part of Isaiah 44:8. It reads, “...Is there a God beside Me? yea, there is _____ God; I know not any.” (no; Note – They context shows that God (through Isaiah) is saying there is NO OTHER God beside Me!)
- e) Could verses 9-20 be entitled, “The useless nature of vain/dead idols?” (Certainly)
- f) In describing the making of these vain/dead idols, Isaiah 44:12 begins, “The _____...” (smith; Note – This is referencing the blacksmith)
- g) In describing the making of these vain/dead idols, Isaiah 44:13 begins, “The _____...” (carpenter)
- h) Concerning those foolishness of those engaging in idolatry, what are the first six words of Isaiah 44:19? (And none considereth in his heart)
- i) Read Isaiah 44:22-24. How many times is the term “redeemed or redeemer” used in this section? (Three times, vs. 22-24)
- j) As a matter of prophecy, is Cyrus mentioned in this chapter? (Yes, vs. 28)

2) Revelation 3 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) What congregation mentioned in this chapter had a name/reputation that they lived, but in reality they were dead? ([Sardis, vs. 1](#))
- b) Referencing a faithful remnant (apparently within a doctrinally sound, but spiritual dead (i.e., no zeal, etc.) congregation, what verse begins, “Thou hast a few names even in Sardis which have not defiled their garments...?” ([Revelation 3:4](#))
- c) What early verse mentions “the key of David?” ([Revelation 3:7](#))
- d) When referencing the congregation at Philadelphia, what does it mean when the Lord said of them, “...for thou hast a little strength...?” ([It seems to mean that they were a relatively smaller congregation. Note – Although they were small, perhaps not well-known, Jesus told them that He had set before them an open door!, vs. 8](#))
- e) What mid-chapter verse begins, “Because thou hast kept the word of My patience...?” ([Revelation 3:10](#))
- f) Revelation 3:12 begins, “Him that _____ will I make a _____ in the temple of My God...” ([overcometh; pillar](#))
- g) The Jehovah’s Witness religion teaches false doctrine concerning the deity of Christ. They FALSELY teach that Jesus was a created being. Often they will wrongly apply Revelation 3:14 wherein (referencing Jesus) the end of the verse says, “...the beginning of the creation of God.” They FALSELY say that this teaches that Jesus was the first created being. Diligent students of the Bible, however, understand that Jesus WAS NOT A CREATED BEING, but instead is Himself also Deity (as is God, the Father and God, the Spirit). In other words, true Bible research shows that there is ONE GOD (Deity) composed of three persons—Father, Son and Holy Spirit (Matt. 3:16-17). What then does the phrase, “the beginning of the creation of God,” actually mean? ([It means that Jesus was the One \(within the Godhead\) that actually began the creation. Read John 1 and Colossians 1. Jesus \(Who is Deity\) was the beginning or beginner of the creation!](#))
- h) Will Jesus accept lukewarm Christianity? ([No!, vs. 15-16](#))
- i) What are the first three words of Revelation 3:18? ([I counsel thee](#))
- j) In Revelation 3:19, Jesus tells the Laodiceans, “As many as I love, I _____ and _____: be zealous therefore, and _____.” ([rebuke; chasten; repent](#))
- k) Read Revelation 3:20 (cf., also Revelation 22:17). Does Jesus want anyone to be lost? ([Of course not. Jesus came to save people \(Luke 19:10\). He gave His life a ransom for many! Sadly, however, most people will CHOOSE to reject Him, Matthew 7:13-15, 21-27](#))

5. **Thursday** –

1) Isaiah 45 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Referring to the call of Cyrus (as a matter of prophecy concerning the restoration of Judah after Babylon captivity), Isaiah 45:1 begins, “Thus saith the Lord to his anointed, to _____.” ([Cyrus](#))
- b) Referring to Judah, Isaiah 45:4 gives the reason for God’s providential use of Cyrus. It begins, “For _____ My servant’s sake...” ([Jacob](#))
- c) What are the first four words of Isaiah 45:6? ([That they may know](#))
- d) What verse begins, “Woe unto him that striveth with His Maker?” ([Isaiah 45:9](#))

- e) Isaiah 45:12 reads, “I have made the _____, and created _____ upon it: I, even My hands, have stretched out the _____, and _____ their host have I commanded.” (earth; man; heavens; all)
- f) The end of what late verse reads, “...I the Lord speak righteousness, I declare things that are right?” (Isaiah 45:19)
- g) What late verse begins, “Look unto Me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth...?” (Isaiah 45:22)
- h) Read Isaiah 45:23-25. Although also having application to the immediate context, does this section also have connection to the New Testament age? (Yes, Cf., Romans 14:11, Philippians 2:10-11, etc.; Also, note the phrase “IN the Lord” as compared to the spiritual blessings available IN CHRIST, Ephesians 1:3ff, etc.)

2) Revelation 4 – Read Only

6. **Friday** –

1) Isaiah 46 – Read & Answer Below

- a) In this chapter the idols/gods of Babylon are denounced. Isaiah 46:1 begins, “_____ boweth down, _____ stoopeth, their idols...” (Bel; Nebo)
- b) Notice the last phrase of Isaiah 46:2. Will the mighty Babylon also fall/go into captivity (along with its false idols/gods)? (Yes!)
- c) Read Isaiah 46:3-4. Did God say that He would “carry” (or remember) the house of Jacob (i.e., Note, God’s providential care for Israel/Judah, especially as connected to His promise to Abraham, etc.)? (Yes! Note – idols/false gods had to be carried by animals when moving somewhere, but in contrast, the true God would carry Judah/Israel.)
- d) What are the first six words of Isaiah 46:8? (Remember this, and shew yourselves men)
- e) Reminding Judah (the house of Jacob) not to choose the sin of idolatry like the Babylonians, God (through the prophet) in the latter part of Isaiah 46:8 declares, “...bring it again to mind, O ye _____.” (transgressors)
- f) The end of Isaiah 46:9 finds the Lord saying, “I am God, and there is _____ like Me.” (none)
- g) Read Isaiah 46:11. In view of context (cf., Isaiah 41:2, 44:28, etc.), would it be sensible to view this verse as a reference to Cyrus and his coming to punish Babylon and release Judah? (Absolutely!)
- h) Read Isaiah 46:10-11. Does the power of prophecy work as one of the great proofs of God? Also, does God’s word come to pass (i.e., does He keep His promises)? (Yes!)
- i) What are the first five words of Isaiah 46:12? (Hearken unto me, ye stouthearted)

2) Revelation 4 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Beginning a new thought/section within this grand book, Revelation 4:1 begins, “After this I _____...” (looked)
- b) Perhaps reminding us of the fact that he was under the guidance/influence of the Holy Spirit (or referencing his mind-set ready to receive the revelation), in what early verse does John write, “And immediately I was in the spirit...?” (Revelation 4:2)

- c) According to Revelation 4:4, how many seats are mentioned as being “round about the throne?” (twenty-four)
- d) Remembering, of course, the highly figurative nature of this inspired book (which is all pointing to the victory available in Christ), what early verse reads, “And out of the throne proceeded lightnings and thunderings and voices: and there were seven lamps of fire burning before the throne, which are the seven Spirits of God?” (Revelation 4:5)
- e) The end of what verse first speaks about, “...four beasts full of eyes before and behind?” (Revelation 4:6)
- f) In this glorious vision, how many wings did each of the beasts have? (They had six wings each, vs. 8)
- g) In what verse is this beautiful statement found—“...saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come?” (Revelation 4:8)
- h) What are the first five words of Revelation 4:11? (Thou art worthy, O Lord)

7. Saturday –

1) Isaiah 47 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As the idols of Babylon would fall (chapter 46), so the kingdom of Babylon would fall (chapter 47). Isaiah 47:1 begins, “Come down, and sit in the dust, O virgin daughter of _____, sit on the ground: there is no throne....” (Babylon)
- b) Isaiah 47:3 is vivid. Speaking of Babylon, it begins, “Thy nakedness shall be uncovered, yea, thy _____ shall be seen....” (shame)
- c) In what early verse does the prophet write that “Chaldeans” (or Babylon) would NO longer be called “The lady of kingdoms?” (Isaiah 47:5)
- d) What verse begins, “Therefore hear now this, thou that art given to pleasures...?” (Isaiah 47:8)
- e) What are the two things that would come to Babylon “in a moment?” (The loss of children and widowhood, vs. 9)
- f) Isaiah 47:10 vividly describes the sinful attitude of Babylon. Isaiah 47:10 begins, “For thou has trusted in thy _____: thou hast said, None seeth me....” (wickedness)
- g) Read Isaiah 47:13-15. Would the false counsels/teachers/religions of Babylon be able to save them from destruction? (No)
- h) Concerning Babylon, what are the last four words of this chapter? (none shall save thee, vs. 15)

2) Revelation 4 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) Does Revelation 4:2 speak of “a throne set in heaven” and also of One sitting “on the throne?” (Yes!)
- b) How many “elders” are pictured as sitting around the throne? (twenty-four, vs. 4, 10)
- c) What did the seated elders have upon their heads? (gold crowns, vs. 4, 10)
- d) Which mid-chapter verse speaks of “a sea of glass like unto crystal?” (Revelation 4:6)
- e) How many “beasts” are mentioned in this chapter? (Four, vs. 6-8)
- f) What Old Testament book should be studied/reviewed when studying Revelation 4:7? (Ezekiel)
- g) Read Revelation 4:8. What chapter in Isaiah should be studied/reviewed (that is similar in nature) to this passage? (Isaiah 6)

- h) What did the seated elders (wearing the crowns) do when the four beasts praised the One seated on the throne? (They fell down (casting their crowns before the throne) and worshipped the One seated upon the throne, vs. 9-11)
- i) Read Revelation 4:8-11. Should we recognize God's authority and (like those mentioned herein) praise/worship Him with profound respect and sincerity? (Absolutely!)
