2. **Monday** –

1) Numbers 10 – Read & Answer Below

- a) How many trumpets of silver did the Lord tell Moses to make? (two, vs. 2)
- b) What were these trumpets to be used for according to Numbers 10:2? (For the calling of the assembly and for the journeying of the camps)
- c) What group was commissioned to “blow with the trumpets?” (The sons of Aaron, the priests, vs. 8)
- d) Were the trumpets also to be blown as an alarm for war? (Yes, vs. 9)
- e) Numbers 10:13 says, “And they first took their _____ according to the _____ of the Lord by the hand of Moses.” (journey; commandment)
- f) After listing the various tribes as it pertained to moving the camp, Numbers 10:28 says, “Thus were the _____ of the children of Israel according to their _____, when they set _____.” (journeyings; armies; forward)
- g) What was the name of the father-in-law of Moses, as mentioned in this chapter? (Hobab, vs. 29)
- h) How many days journey did the Israelites go from “the mount of the Lord?” (Three days journey, vs. 33)

3. **Tuesday** –

1) Numbers 11 – Read & Answer Below

- a) This chapter begins with the words, “And when the people _____, it _____ the _____....” (complained; displeased; Lord, vs. 1)
- b) What was the place called where “the fire of the Lord burnt among them?” (Taberah, vs. 3)
- c) Describe “manna” as it is depicted in this chapter. (it was as coriander seed, and the color...as bdellium, vs. 7. Also, the taste ...was as the taste of fresh oil, vs. 8)
- d) Who is specifically mentioned as being angry/displeased at the Israelites griping about the manna? (God and Moses, vs. 10)
- e) How many men “of the elders of Israel” was Moses allowed to gather so that he would not have to “bear the burden of the people” by himself? (Seventy, vs. 16-17)
- f) What two verses give a glimpse of the true greatness of Moses? These two verses involve a discussion between Moses and his young minister, Joshua. (Numbers 11:28-29)

- g) What type of “flesh” or meat, did God provide for the people? (Quails, vs. 31. The text says that God provided so many that they were spread out a day’s journey in both directions and were piled-up 3 feet high!!)
- h) What happened to the people who “lusted” or were greedy over the quail? (God smote such with a very great plague killing them, vs. 33-34)
- i) What was the place called where this lusting occurred? (Kibrothhattavah, vs. 34)

2) Mark 15 – Read & Answer Below

- a) What did they do to Jesus just before they “carried Him away, and delivered Him to Pilate?” (They “bound Jesus,” vs. 1)
- b) What did Pilate do when Jesus “answered nothing,” even though His false accusers “accused Him of many things?” (Pilate “marveled,” vs. 5)
- c) What person did the people want released instead of Jesus? (Barabbas, vs. 11)
- d) What type of crown did they put upon Jesus? (A crown of thorns, vs. 17)
- e) What does “Golgotha” mean? (The place of a skull, vs. 22)
- f) How long was the darkness upon the land while Jesus was on the cross? (Three hours, vs. 33)
- g) When Jesus died on the cross, what did the Centurion, who was standing by Him, say? (He said, “Truly this man was the Son of God, vs. 39)
- h) What person besought Pilate for the body of Jesus so that he could bury Him? (Joseph of Arimathaea, vs. 43, 45)

4. Wednesday –

1) Numbers 12 – Read & Answer Below

- a) What two people “spake against Moses?” (Miriam and Aaron, vs. 1)
- b) What nationality of woman did Moses marry? (An Ethiopian woman, vs. 1)
- c) Numbers 12:2 says, “And they said, Hath the Lord indeed spoken only by _____? Hath He not spoken also by us? And the _____ it.” (Moses; Lord; heard)
- d) Was Moses meek or not meek? (He was meek, vs. 3)
- e) How did God say He spoke to Moses, as opposed to other prophets? (He said that He spoke with Moses “mouth to mouth,” vs. 8. With the other prophets, God said that He spoke to them in a vision or a dream, etc., vs. 6)
- f) What happened to Miriam after God’s anger was kindled? (She became leprous, vs. 10)
- g) When Miriam became leprous, what did Aaron do? (Aaron beseeched Moses not to lay their sin of “speaking against him” upon them. He also said that they had acted “foolishly” and said, “we have sinned,” vs. 11)
- h) How many days did Miriam have to stay outside the camp? (Seven days, vs. 15)

2) Mark 15 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) What heinous act had Barabbas committed during the insurrection? (Murder, vs. 7)
- b) Pilate knew that Jesus was delivered by the chief priests for what reason? (Because of their envy, vs. 10)
- c) What does the text say as to the reason “why” Pilate delivered Barabbas and had Jesus crucified? (The text says, “And so Pilate, willing to content the people...,” vs. 15)

- d) What color garment did the Roman soldiers cloth Jesus in, so that they could mock Him? (Purple, vs. 17, 20)
- e) At what hour did they crucify Jesus? (The third hour, that is, 9:00 am, vs. 25)
- f) What Old Testament Scripture is referenced in Mark 15:28? (Isaiah 53:12)
- g) What was placed in front of the tomb of Jesus in order to seal it? (A stone, vs. 46)

5. **Thursday** –

1) Numbers 13 – Read & Answer Below

- a) How many spies were sent to “search the land of Canaan?” (twelve, vs. 2)
- b) Does the text actually list the name of the spies? (Yes, vs. 4-16)
- c) What name did Moses give to Oshea? (Jehoshua (i.e., Joshua), vs. 16)
- d) After telling the spies to “be...of good courage,” what did Moses tell them to bring back? (He said to bring of the fruit of the land, vs. 20)
- e) What “brook” is mentioned several times in this chapter? It is the brook where they cut down the cluster of grapes. (The brook of Eschol, vs. 23-24)
- f) How many days did they spy out the land? In other words, how many days did they search out the land before they returned? (Forty days, vs. 25)
- g) In Numbers 13:30 _____ says, “Let us _____ up at once, and _____ it; for we are well _____ to overcome it.” (Caleb; go; possess; able)
- h) What type of report did the 10 rebellious spies bring back, as it pertained to taking the land? (They brought up an evil report, saying, “We be not able to go up against the people; for they are stronger than we,” vs. 31-32)

6. **Friday** –

1) Numbers 14 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Did the people accept the report of Caleb (and Joshua) or the report of the other ten spies? (They accepted the evil report of the rebellious spies, rejecting even Moses and Aaron, vs. 1-2, 6ff)
- b) Did the people desire to return to Egypt? (Yes, vs. 4)
- c) What were the people about to do to Moses, Aaron, Joshua and Caleb? (They were about to stone them with stones, vs. 10)
- d) What is the reaction of Moses in light of such harsh criticism and rebellion? (Moses prays for the people and begs God to be merciful and longsuffering with them, vs. 19)
- e) Numbers 14:24 reads, “But My servant _____, because he had another spirit with him, and hath _____ Me _____, him will I bring into the land wherein he went; and his seed shall possess it.” (Caleb; followed; fully)
- f) What age group does God say “would” be able to enter the land? (Those under 20 years old, vs. 29)
- g) Besides “Caleb,” what other person does this chapter specifically mention as also being able to enter the land of promise? (Joshua, vs. 30, 38)
- h) What verse in this chapter specifically mentions that they would “wander in the wilderness forty years?” (Numbers 14:33)
- i) Were the 10 evil spies punished for their rebellion? (Yes, vs. 37)

- j) After Moses told the people of their punishment (i.e., 40 years of wilderness wandering), what was their reaction? (They acknowledged their sin and were ready to “go up,” but it was too late, vs. 40ff. They had made their bed and now they would have to sleep in it!)

2) Mark 16 – Read & Answer Below

- a) What day of the week was it, when the ladies came to the empty tomb of Jesus? (The first day of the week, vs. 2)
- b) Was the stone that had been rolled away from the entrance of Christ’s tomb, small or large? (It was large. The text actually says, “it was very great,” vs. 4)
- c) What was the “young man” or angel/messenger that the ladies encountered, wearing? (He was “clothed in a long white garment, vs. 5)
- d) Were the ladies startled and/or afraid after their encounter with the heavenly messenger? (Yes, vs. 5, 8)
- e) Was Jesus pleased with “the eleven” (i.e., His apostles) when they did not believe the testimony of the women who saw Him? (No. This is made clear in vs. 14)
- f) According to Mark 16:16, what TWO things does Jesus specifically mention as being necessary to one’s salvation? (Belief and Baptism)
- g) Understanding that Mark 16:17-18 addresses the days of the miraculous (during the first century), what does Mark 16:20 teach regarding the actual purpose of the miraculous? (It shows that the purpose of such miracles was to “confirm the word with signs following.” In other words, “the signs” worked by the inspired spokesmen “confirmed” their words as actually being “from” God. Stated another way, the miracles/signs performed pointed to the fact that these spokesmen were from God. That is, they were not simply speaking the words of mere men. These miracles/signs “proved” that they were who they claimed to be—inspired of God.)

7. Saturday –

1) Numbers 15 – Read & Answer Below

- a) According to Numbers 15:1-16, did God have a “manner” or pattern that He expected their offerings to adhere to? (Yes, vs. 12-13)
- b) Considering this same section, did the Israelite and the stranger among them (i.e., proselyte) have a different pattern to follow? (No, vs. 13-16. In fact, vs. 16 says, “One law and one manner shall be for you, and for the stranger that sojourneth with you.”)
- c) In Numbers 15:17-21 what type of offering is mentioned several times? (An heave offering, vs. 19-21)
- d) What are the two types of sins discussed in Numbers 15:22-31? (Sinning through 1) ignorance and 2) presumptuously, vs. 24ff, 30)
- e) On what day was the man discussed in Numbers 15:32ff, found gathering sticks? (On the Sabbath Day, vs. 32)
- f) What was this man’s punishment? (He was stoned to death, vs. 36)
- g) What was the purpose of the special fringes they were to put in the borders of their garments? (They were to remind them of all of God’s commandments and of the fact they should do them and not follow their own heart, vs. 39-40)

2) Mark 16 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) At what time of day, upon the first day of the week, did the ladies come to the grave of Jesus? (At the rising of the sun, vs. 2)
- b) Did the angel/messenger of God “specifically” state that Jesus had risen? (Absolutely!!, vs. 6)
- c) On what day of the week did Jesus raise from the dead? (The first day of the week, vs. 9)
- d) Did Jesus first appear to a man or a woman? (To a woman, vs. 9)
- e) Mark 16:16 says, “He that believeth _____ is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.” (and)
- f) What TWO things does the conjunction “and” tie together in Mark 16:16? (Belief and Baptism)
- g) In Mark 16:16, does Jesus say, “He that believes ONLY shall be saved?” (No)
- h) In Mark 16:16, does Jesus say, “He that is baptized ONLY shall be saved?” (No)
- i) In Mark 16:16, does Jesus say, “He that believeth AND is baptized shall be saved?” (Yes)
- j) According to Jesus, in Mark 16:16, are both belief AND baptism tied to one’s being saved? (Absolutely!!)
