- c) What verse says, “Wherefore then do ye harden your hearts, as the Egyptians and Pharaoh hardened their hearts?” (1 Samuel 6:6)
- d) 1 Samuel 6:8 reads, “And take the _____ of the Lord, and lay it upon the _____; and put the jewels of _____, which ye return Him for a _____ offering, in a coffer by the side thereof; and send it away, that it may go.” (ark; cart; gold; trespass)
- e) 1 Samuel 6:11 says, “And they laid the _____ of the Lord upon the cart, and the _____ with the mice of _____ and the _____ of their emerods.” (ark; coffer; gold; images)

- a) 1 Samuel 7:1 begins, “And the men of _____ came, and fetched up the ark of the Lord, and brought it into the house of _____.” (Kirjathjearim; Abinadab)
- b) How many years did “the ark” abide in Kirjathjearim? (Twenty years, vs. 2)
- c) What great prophet of God said, “If ye do return unto the Lord with all your hearts, then put away the strange gods and Ashtaroth from among you, and prepare your hearts...?” (Samuel, vs. 3)
- d) What person “judged the children of Israel in Mizpeh?” (Samuel, vs. 6)
- e) When “Samuel was offering up the burnt offering,” what group “drew near to battle against Israel?” (The Philistines, vs. 10)
- f) What did Samuel name the stone that he set “between Mizpeh and Shen?” (Ebenezer, vs. 12)
- g) What person “judged Israel all the days of his life?” (Samuel, vs. 15)
- h) The text says that this judge “went from year to year in _____ to Bethel, and Gilgal, and Mizpeh, and _____ Israel in all those places.” (circuit; judged, vs. 16)
- i) This judge’s house was located where? (In Ramah, vs. 17)

2) John 13 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) Did Jesus love people? (Without question. As vs. 1 says, Jesus “loved his own which were in the world, He loved them unto the end.”)
- b) What two verses in this chapter specifically mention the Devil/Satan? (John 13:2 and John 13:27. Note, the text says that “the devil...put into the heart of Judas” and also “Satan entered into him,” however, the text does NOT say

that such was a matter of direct influence, etc. In fact, the text does not specify “in what manner” the devil “put into the heart of Judas” or “in what manner” Satan “entered into him.” The text states “the fact,” but not “the manner or the how.” In other words, a complete study of the Bible will clearly show that man has free will and that the Devil does not control the choices of people. Yes, Satan is real. Yes, the Devil tempts. However, it is man’s choice as to whether or not he will give in to such temptations. Such is the whole nature of this life!! Compare, 2 Corinthians 2:11 and 11:3, Ephesians 6:10-11, etc.)

- c) What apostle of Christ said, in reference to Jesus washing his feet, “...Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head?” (Simon Peter, vs. 9)
- d) In what verse did Jesus say, “If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another’s feet?” (John 13:14)
- e) In what verse did Jesus say, “...I have given you an example...?” (John 13:15)
- f) What Old Testament Scripture does Jesus reference in John 13:18? (Psalm 41:9)
- g) John 13:19 is an awesome verse. In it, Jesus says, “Now I tell you _____ it come _____, when it is come to pass, ye may _____ that I am He.” (before; that; believe)
- h) Who “beckoned” to the disciple “whom Jesus loved” wanting him to ask Jesus a question regarding the betrayer? (It was Peter who beckoned to the disciple “leaning on Jesus’ bosom,” vs. 22-25)
- i) What verse says, “...and it was night?” (John 13:30)
- j) In what verse did Jesus tell Peter, “...Wither I go, thou canst not follow Me now; but thou shalt follow Me afterwards?” (John 13:36)
- k) What apostle, boldly said to Christ, “...I will lay down my life for Thy sake?” (Peter, vs. 37)

- d) In 1 Samuel 8:5, the elders of Israel tell Samuel, “...now make us a _____ to _____ us like all the _____.” (king; judge; nations)
- e) God told Samuel that the people “have not rejected thee, but they have rejected _____.” (Me, vs. 7)
- f) 1 Samuel 8:9 records, “Now therefore hearken unto their voice: howbeit yet _____ solemnly unto them, and shew them the _____ of the _____ that shall reign over them.” (protest; manner; king)
- g) In 1 Samuel 8:11, after saying, “This will be the manner of the king that shall reign over you,” the text says of the king, “He will _____.” (take)
- h) What verse says, “And ye shall cry out in that day because of your king which ye shall have chosen you; and the Lord will not hear you in that day?” (1 Samuel 8:18)

Compare, Romans 1:24ff, “Wherefore God also gave them up to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts...vs. 26, For this cause God gave them up, vs. 28, ...God gave them over....” God allows men to make choices, but there are consequences for wrong choices, just as there are blessing for right choices!!)

- e) “...a Prophet was beforetime called a _____.” (Seer, vs. 9)
- f) What was the name of the Prophet or Seer that Saul and his servant sought out? (Samuel, vs. 14)
- g) 1 Samuel 9:15 says, “Now the _____ had told _____ in his ear a day before _____ came, saying....” (Lord; Samuel; Saul)
- h) How many days had the asses or donkeys (the ones Saul was looking for) been lost? (Three days, vs. 20)

- g) What relative of Saul’s said to him, “Tell me, I pray thee, what Samuel said unto you?” (This was Saul’s uncle, vs. 14-16)
- h) Per 1 Samuel 10:19, Samuel declares, “And ye have this day _____ your God, who Himself saved you out of _____ your adversities and your tribulations; and ye have said unto Him, Nay, but set a _____ over us....” (rejected; all; king)
- i) Of what person does the inspired text speak, when it says, “...and when they sought him, he could not be found...Behold, he hath hid himself among the stuff?” (Saul, vs. 21-22)

2) John 14 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) As this chapter opens, what person is speaking (as recorded by the inspired apostle John)? (Jesus, 13:38 starts out, “Jesus answered him...,” and vs. 1 of this chapter continues the context)
- b) In what verse does Jesus say that He is, “...the way, the truth, and the life?” (John 14:6)
- c) Is a person able to come to God outside of Christ? (No, not at all, vs. 6)
- d) In what verse does Jesus say, “...or else believe Me for the very works’ sake?” (John 14:11)
- e) In John 14:16, when Jesus says, “And I will pray the Father, and He shall give YOU another Comforter, that He may abide with YOU for ever,” who is the “YOU” under consideration? In other words, the “YOU” refers to what person or persons? (The student needs to go back to John 13:2 and the context)

becomes very clear. John 13:2 begins, “And supper being ended....” Of what “supper” does the text speak? Certainly, as the context shows, this is the “last supper,” and it refers to the same supper as found in Matthew 26:20, etc. In Matthew 26:20, the text says, “Now when the even was come, He sat down with the twelve.” In other words, this involved Jesus’ meal with the TWELVE APOSTLES during the last supper. This context is very important when studying John 14-16. If not, the student will end up believing and/or teaching all manner of wild doctrines regarding the Holy Spirit when such IN CONTEXT clearly deals with Jesus sending the Holy Spirit to guide/inspire the apostles after His departure. Thus, the YOU has reference to the apostles. Perhaps you could read it this way for clarity sake, “And I (Jesus) will pray the Father, and He shall give you (the Apostles) another Comforter, that He may abide with you (the Apostles) for ever.” This is the context! Note, this will become very clear as we study through chapters 15 and 16.)

- h) In making the context clear, as to “who” Jesus is speaking to, John 14:25 says, “These things have I spoken unto _____, being yet _____ with you.” (you; present)
- i) In John 14:26, Jesus teaches, “But the _____, which is the _____ Ghost, whom the _____ will send in My name, He shall _____ you _____ things, and bring all things to your _____, whatsoever I have said unto you.” (Comforter; Holy; Father; teach; all; remembrance)
