**WEEK 84 – Psalm 21 – 26 & Galatians 5 – 6**

## **WEEK 84 – ANSWERS**

1. **Sunday** – Worship/Time With Family/Review Answers With Others

2. **Monday** –

1) **Psalm 21 – Read & Answer Below**

- a) As this Psalm opens, does the psalmist discuss “the joy” of salvation or “the despair and trouble” connected with salvation? (He speaks of “the joy” concerning the salvation from God. It causes him to “greatly...rejoice,” vs. 1)
- b) Per Psalm 21:2, did God listen to his prayer or reject his prayer? (God listened to his prayer. As the text says, God did not withhold (i.e., reject) “the request of his lips.”)
- c) What verse says, “He asked life of Thee, and Thou gavest it him, even length of days...?” (Psalm 21:4)
- d) What verse begins, “For the king trusteth in the Lord...?” (Psalm 21:7)
- e) What verse says of God, “Thine hand shall find out all Thine enemies...?” (Psalm 21:8)
- f) Discussing God’s overthrow of the enemies, Psalm 21:9 tells us, “...the Lord shall swallow them up in His \_\_\_\_\_.” (wrath)
- g) Talking about God, Psalm 21:13 ends this inspired chapter thusly, “...so will we \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ Thy power.” (sing; praise)

2) **Galatians 5 – Read Only**

3. **Tuesday** –

1) **Psalm 22 – Read & Answer Below**

- a) Does Jesus quote Psalm 22:1 while He is on the Cross (See Matthew 27:46)? (Yes. In so doing Jesus fulfilled prophecy.)
- b) What verse says, “Our fathers trusted in Thee: they trusted, and Thou didst deliver them?” (Psalm 22:4)
- c) In opposition to Psalm 22:4-5, the first two words of Psalm 22:6 are, “\_\_\_\_\_” (But; I)
- d) Does Psalm 22:6-8 involve Messianic prophecies concerning Christ on the Cross? (Absolutely! Cf., Matthew 27:39-44; Mark 15:29-30, etc.)
- e) In what verse does the prophetic psalmist cry, “Many bulls have compassed me...?” (Psalm 22:12)
- f) Picturing the suffering Christ on the cross, Psalm 22:15 reads, “My strength is dried up like a \_\_\_\_\_; and my \_\_\_\_\_ cleaveth to my jaws; and Thou has brought me into the dust of \_\_\_\_\_.” (potsherd; tongue; death)
- g) In what verse does the psalmist prophesy of Christ, “...they pierced My hands and My feet?” (Psalm 22:16)
- h) Again in prophetic fashion, Psalm 22:18 tells us, “They part my garments among them, and cast \_\_\_\_\_ upon my \_\_\_\_\_.” (lots; vesture)
- i) What verse reads, “I will declare Thy name unto My brethren: in the midst of the congregation will I praise Thee?” (Psalm 22:22)

j) What verse in this chapter declares, “For the kingdom is the Lord’s: and He is the Governor among the nations?” (Psalm 22:28)

2) Galatians 5 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Remembering the background of this book (i.e., the false teachers trying to bind parts of the Law of Moses into Christianity), Galatians 5:1 reads, “Stand fast therefore in the \_\_\_\_\_ wherewith \_\_\_\_\_ hath made us free, and be not entangled \_\_\_\_\_ with the yoke of \_\_\_\_\_.” (liberty; Christ; again; bondage)
- b) Does “circumcision” apparently have something to do with “what” certain ones were trying to bind upon the brethren at Galatia? (Yes. Galatians 5:2ff)
- c) According to the inspired apostle Paul and according to the words of Galatians 5:4, is it possible for a Christian to be involved in actions to the point that it might be said that he or she has “fallen from grace?” (Yes! This verse is not hard to understand. Paul was saying very clearly to the brethren at Galatia that if they were trying to be justified by the Law of Moses that they would FALL FROM GRACE!)
- d) What verse contains the beautiful phrase, “...but faith which worketh by love?” (Galatians 5:6)
- e) In what verse does Paul pen, “I would they were even cut off which trouble you?” (Galatians 5:12)
- f) Galatians 5:15 declares, “But if ye \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ one another, take heed that ye be not \_\_\_\_\_ one of another.” (bite; devour; consumed)
- g) What verse in this chapter begins, “Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these...?” (Galatians 5:19)
- h) What verse in this chapter begins, “But the fruit of the Spirit is...?” (Galatians 5:22)

4. Wednesday –

1) Psalm 23 – Read & Answer Below

- a) The psalmist declares that “The \_\_\_\_\_ is my shepherd.” (Lord, vs. 1)
- b) The psalmist says that the Lord leads him beside “the \_\_\_\_\_ waters.” (still, vs. 2)
- c) What famous verse in this famous chapter records, “Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil...?” (Psalm 23:4)
- d) Why does the psalmist not fear death? (Because God is with him and God guides him and comforts him through His teachings, vs. 4)
- e) In what verse does the psalmist declare, “...my cup runneth over?” (Psalm 23:5)
- f) Does the inspired penman write, “...and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever?” (Yes, vs. 6)

2) Galatians 5 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) For those who were trying to bind the necessity of circumcision as an element within Christianity, Paul stated (in Galatians 5:3), “For I testify again to every man that is \_\_\_\_\_, that he is a \_\_\_\_\_ to do the \_\_\_\_\_ law.” (circumcised; debtor; whole)
- b) Galatians 5:4 reads, “Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are \_\_\_\_\_ from \_\_\_\_\_.” (fallen; grace)

- c) Galatians 5:6 reads, “For \_\_\_ Christ Jesus neither \_\_\_\_\_ availeth any thing, nor \_\_\_\_\_; but \_\_\_\_\_ which worketh by \_\_\_\_\_.” (in; [circumcision; uncircumcision; faith; love](#))
- d) In what verse does the inspired apostle declare, “A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump?” ([Galatians 5:9](#))
- e) In what verse does Paul state, “...but he that troubleth you shall bear his judgment, whosoever he be?” ([Galatians 5:10](#))
- f) In what verse does Paul say, “...but by love serve one another?” ([Galatians 5:13](#))
- g) How many specific items are listed among the “works of the flesh” (not counting “and such like”)? ([17 items, vs. 19-21](#))
- h) Does the phrase “and such like” (vs. 21) imply that God expects people to be able to determine what “and such like” means? ([Absolutely! God doesn’t waste words or command impossibilities! By specific study on the seventeen items herein listed and by applying THE PRINCIPLES of the Bible we ARE ABLE TO KNOW what “and such like” means. It is tragic and sad when men “flirt” with sin and wickedness, trying to walk on the edge of the cliff. The “and such like” clause will condemn such men one day! Children of the light do not “flirt” with sin—any of it!](#))
- i) List the “fruit of the Spirit.” ([Love, Joy, Peace, Longsuffering, Gentleness, Goodness, Faith, Meekness, Temperance](#))
- j) Read Galatians 5:25. What does it mean to “live in the Spirit/walk in the Spirit?” ([Read Ephesians 6:17. How does the Spirit work? The answer – Through His inspired Word \(i.e., The Bible, John 16:13; 2 Timothy 3:16-17\)! To live in the Spirit and/or to walk in the Spirit is obviously a reference to living according to God’s truth—according to the teachings of the Holy Spirit, as given within Holy Writ. Christians do not live under the Law of Moses; Rather, Christians are to live faithful and godly lives in accordance with the Gospel of Christ. Children of God must not live according to the “works of the flesh,” but instead they should “let the Word of Christ dwell in them richly” \(Colossians 3:16\)](#))
- k) This chapter ends, “Let us not be desirous of vain glory, \_\_\_\_\_ one another, \_\_\_\_\_ one another.” ([provoking; envying, vs. 26](#))

## 5. **Thursday** –

- 1) Psalm 24 – Read & Answer Below
  - a) According to this chapter, “the earth” and the things thereof belong to man or God? ([Everything belongs to “the Lord,” vs. 1](#))
  - b) What questions are given in Psalm 24:3? ([“Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? Or who shall stand in His holy place?”](#))
  - c) Per this chapter, is having “a pure heart” necessary to pleasing God? ([Yes! Cf., vs. 4](#))
  - d) With the background of the Ark of the Covenant coming into Jerusalem (with a view toward the ascension of Christ coming into Glory after his time on earth), Psalm 24:7 reads, “Lift up your heads, O ye \_\_\_\_\_; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting \_\_\_\_\_; and the \_\_\_\_\_ of glory shall come in.” ([gates; doors; King](#))
  - e) What question begins Psalm 24:8? ([“Who is this King of glory?”](#))
  - f) What question begins Psalm 24:10? ([The same question as verse 8 – “Who is this King of glory?”](#))

g) Psalm 24:10 clearly reveals “the King of glory,” when it says, “...The \_\_\_\_\_ of hosts, He is the King of glory. Selah.” (Lord)

2) Galatians 6 – Read Only

6. **Friday** –

1) Psalm 25 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Psalm 25:1-2 declares, “Unto Thee, O \_\_\_\_\_, do I lift up my \_\_\_\_\_. O my \_\_\_\_\_, I \_\_\_\_\_ in Thee: let me not be \_\_\_\_\_, let not mine \_\_\_\_\_ triumph over me.” (Lord; soul; God; trust; ashamed; enemies)
- b) Psalm 25:4 finds the psalmist saying, “Shew me Thy \_\_\_\_\_, O Lord; \_\_\_\_\_ me Thy \_\_\_\_\_.” (ways; teach; paths)
- c) In what verse does the psalmist plead, “Remember not the sins of my youth...?” (Psalm 25:7)
- d) What verse states, “Good and upright is the Lord: therefore will He teach sinners in the way?” (Psalm 25:8)
- e) What verse teaches, “The secret of the Lord is with them that fear Him...?” (Psalm 25:14)
- f) In Psalm 25:18, the inspired writer pens, “Look upon mine affliction and my pain; and \_\_\_\_\_ all my \_\_\_\_\_.” (forgive; sins)
- g) Psalm 25:20 reads, “O keep my \_\_\_\_\_, and \_\_\_\_\_ me....” (soul; deliver)
- h) How many times is the term “ashamed” mentioned in this chapter? (Four times, vs. 2-3, 20)

2) Galatians 6 – Read & Answer Below

- a) What is the first word of this chapter? (Brethren, vs. 1)
- b) Galatians 6:1 declares, “Brethren, if a man be \_\_\_\_\_ in a fault, ye which are \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering \_\_\_\_\_, lest thou also be tempted.” (overtaken; spiritual; restore; thyself)
- c) Galatians 6:2 teaches us, “Bear ye one another’s \_\_\_\_\_, and so fulfill the \_\_\_\_\_ of Christ.” (burdens; law)
- d) Galatians 6:5 likewise teaches, “For every man shall \_\_\_\_\_ his \_\_\_\_\_ burden.” (bear; own)
- e) What verse in this great chapter reads, “Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap?” (Galatians 6:7)
- f) Galatians 6:9 encourages us thusly, “And let us not be \_\_\_\_\_ in \_\_\_\_\_: for in due season we shall reap, \_\_\_\_\_ we faint not.” (weary; well-doing; if)
- g) In Galatians 6:15, the inspired apostle pens, “For \_\_\_\_\_ Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature.” (in)
- h) In what verse of this chapter does Paul refer to Christians (i.e., the church) as being the true “the Israel of God?” (Galatians 6:16)

7. **Saturday** –

1) Psalm 26 – Read & Answer Below

- a) As this chapter opens (26:1), “what” does David ask the Lord to do to him? (To Judge him, vs. 1)

- b) What does David ask God to do to him in Psalm 26:2? (Examine him and prove him. Also, he asks God to “try my reins and my heart.”)
  - c) In what verse does he say, “...I have walked in Thy truth?” (Psalm 26:3)
  - d) In what verse does he say, “I have hated the congregation of evildoers; and will not sit with the wicked?” (Psalm 26:5)
  - e) The psalmist wanted to “publish with the voice of \_\_\_\_\_, and tell of all [God’s] wondrous \_\_\_\_\_.” (thanksgiving; works, vs. 7)
  - f) He says of the bloody and wicked men, that “their \_\_\_\_\_ hand is full of bribes.” (right, vs. 10)
  - g) Per Psalm 26:11, what two things does the writer ask God to do for him as he walks in integrity? (He asks God to, “redeem me, and be merciful unto me.”)
  - h) This chapter ends, “...in the \_\_\_\_\_ will I bless the Lord.” (congregation, vs. 12)
- 2) Galatians 6 – Read & Word Study/Research
- a) Please read Galatians 6:1. Is it possible for a brother to fall into sin and thus need to be restored? (Yes! How could a verse be more clear. Cf., James 5:19-20)
  - b) In what verse is the New Testament referred to as “the law of Christ?” (Galatians 6:2)
  - c) Galatians 6:3 reads, “For if a man think himself to be something, when he is \_\_\_\_\_, he \_\_\_\_\_ himself.” (nothing; deceiveth)
  - d) In brief, please explain the meaning of Galatians 6:6. (It is speaking of the support of those that preach the gospel. In other words, let those who are “taught in the word” give or “communicate unto him that teacheth.” Compare also, 1 Corinthians 9:11-14, 1 Timothy 5:17, etc. Note also, this letter was written to THE CHURCH in Galatia (Galatians 1:2). A local congregation should support the man or men who “labor” in the preaching/teaching/evangelism. At least they are certainly authorized to do so. Certainly one might preach/teach for free (cf., Paul at times), but the support of the preacher/teacher IS of God. A sound and good man cannot be paid too much and a weak and unsound man cannot be paid too little!)
  - e) Galatians 6:10 commands, “As \_\_\_ have therefore opportunity, let us do \_\_\_\_\_ unto \_\_\_ men, especially unto them who are of the \_\_\_\_\_ of faith.” (we; good; all; household)
  - f) Speaking of the false teachers who were trying to bind the necessity of circumcision within Christianity (and speaking of their motive), in what verse did Paul say, “...they constrain you to be circumcised; only lest they should suffer persecution for the cross of Christ?” (Galatians 6:12)
  - g) In what verse does Paul write, “But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world?” (Galatians 6:14)
  - h) In what verse does the abused Paul say, “...for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus?” (Galatians 6:17)
